RE: Assembly Bill 849 (Reves) - Support

Dear Assemblymember Stone:

On behalf of the California Women's Law Center, we write in support of AB 849 which will help protect the rights of nursing home residents by restoring their ability to seek damages for each violation they experience.

Under the Long-Term Care Act, a current or former nursing home resident may bring a civil action against a nursing home that violates their rights. Last year, the California Supreme Court held that the maximum a victim could recover was \$500, regardless of how many violations the resident suffered or their severity. As noted in the dissent, capping damages at \$500 is "plainly insufficient to fulfill the statute's purpose to deter and remedy violations of nursing home patients' rights."

Years of lax enforcement and the Supreme Court's ruling have left residents without anywhere to turn to protect their rights by rendering the Long-Term Care Act toothless. The pandemic has underscored and added to the levels of isolation, fear, sickness and death that has taken place in California's nursing homes, with complaints against these facilities at an all-time high.

Nursing homes are now free from consequence for violations, often sending resident victims a \$500 check which essentially gives these facilities a "pass" to commit multiple violations. AB 849 will deter violations of residents' rights by restoring nursing home patients' ability to seek damages for each violation they have suffered.

CWLC's mission is to create a more just and equitable society by breaking down barriers and advancing the potential of women and girls through transformative litigation, policy advocacy, and education. AB 849 will help ensure that nursing home residents have a more powerful and effective path to justice.

For these reasons, the California Women's Law Center supports AB 849.
