

The mission of CWLC is to create a more just and equitable society by breaking down barriers and advancing the potential of women and girls through transformative litigation, policy advocacy, and education. CWLC prioritizes four main areas of advocacy: gender discrimination, violence against women, women's economic security, and women's health and reproductive rights. Our work is predominantly focused on assisting low-income women, girls, and communities of color. We

urge law school students passionate about our mission to apply for an internship with us. Because we encourage students to seek out projects that align both with their aspirations and with CWLC's goals, our interns have the opportunity to work on wide-ranging issues that matter to them. The breadth of our core issue areas allows for meaningful advocacy and impactful change throughout California.

Responsibilities: CWLC seeks a motivated self-starter who will help formulate and implement CWLC's strategies to secure justice for women and girls. As a CWLC intern, you will

- Work with and support the Legal Director, Staff Attorneys, and other staff on all aspects of CWLC's legal work;
- Engage in policy advocacy, draft legislative support letters, collaborate with partner organizations, and assist with advocacy at the local, state, and federal level;
- Conduct factual and legal research and draft letters, briefs, and memos to further our legal work;
- Participate in client meetings, attorney meetings, court appearances, and mediations;
- Write blog posts, policy/issue briefs and other similar external facing communications;
- Assist in responding to intake calls and calls for referrals;
- Participate in developing and conducting legal trainings for our communities;
- Perform other duties as required to further the mission of the organization.

Time Commitment: Semester internships require a commitment of 12-16 hours per week with hybrid work options available. Our part-time internships are available during fall and spring semesters. We offer full-time positions for ten weeks (35 hours a week) during the summer.

Compensation is available for those students who do not receive course credit. Arrangements can be made with educational institutions for work study or course credit.
